Happy New Year to all our club members — senior and junior.

As we head into the second half of the season a number of Saints senior and junior teams are well positioned for the post-season finals.

In the Junior competition, all eleven Saints teams are in the top 4 in their competition. In the first season of an U19B competition, our team currently sits in first place. The U11B team also leads its series.

Those teams currently

placing second include the U16A, U14C, U12B, U10South and U8South teams.

Placed third in their series are the U16C and U12A teams.

The 14A and U9North teams are currently fourth in their competitions.

Amongst the 8 senior teams, at the Christmas break the B1 team is a clear leader in its division. The B2 team, sitting in fifth, is not out of contention for the finals.

In F Grade, the Division 2 team is first in its competition.

Finally, in G Grade, the Division 1 team is leading in a close competition whilst in Division 2 our two teams are in second and third position.

Last innings and Georgia put bat to ball hitting a great shot to get to third base. We were all out and Greenway won 10 to 7.
















Saturday 7 November
