



Public Officer

- The Committee shall ensure that a person is appointed as Public Officer.
- The first Public Officer shall be the person who completed the application for incorporation of the League.
- The Committee may at any time remove the Public Officer and appoint a new Public Officer provided the person appointed is 18 years of age or older and a resident of New South Wales.
- The Public Officer shall be deemed to have vacated their position in the following circumstances:
 - death
 - resignation
 - removal by the Committee or at a General Meeting
 - bankruptcy or financial insolvency
 - mental illness
 - residency outside New South Wales
- When a vacancy occurs in the position of Public Officer the Committee shall **within fourteen (14) days** notify the Corporate Affairs Commission by the prescribed form and appoint a new Public Officer.
- The Public Officer is required to notify the Corporate Affairs Commission by the prescribed form in the following circumstances:
 - appointment (within 14 days)
 - a change of residential address (within 14 days)
 - a change in the Leagues objects or rules (within one month)
 - a change in the membership of the Committee (within 14 days)
 - of the Leagues financial affairs (within one month after the Annual General Meeting)
 - a change in the Leagues name (within one month)

The Public Officer may be an office bearer, committee member, or any other person regarded as suitable for the position by the Committee
